The Judges

Judge A: Lori Gordon

Lori is the co-owner and manager of Post Quarter Horses since 1986. Lori and her students have placed Top 3 at the AQHA World Show and Top 5 at Quarter Horse Congress. She holds two Bachelor of Science degrees in business administration and communications. Some of the shows she has judged are the AQHA Level 1 Championships, World Shows for APHA, NSBA, ApHC, PHBA, PtHA, ABRA, IBHA, and POAC. Additionally, she has judged IHSA Semifinals and YEDA Nationals. Internationally she has judged in Australia, Japan, Belgium, Denmark, Germany and European Championships. She is an AQHA and APHA Professional Horseman and served for 5 years as an AQHA Steward. Lori has done clinics and has been successfully training and judging for over 35 years.

Judge B: Mike Bednarek

Mike has been a trainer and coach for 50 years and had the opportunity to coach Cazenovia College IHSA team for 9 years. Mike holds 7 judges' cards in AQHA, NRHA, NRCHA, NSBA, PHBA, ApHC and IBHA. Mike fit and stood several stallions over the course of his career and can boast several World and Reserve Champions along with multiple Congress Champions.

Judge C: Sandy Curl

Sandy has been a judge and horse professional for 45 years. Sandy has had the opportunity to judge worldwide including Europe and Australia. She holds judges' cards in 10 associations, AQHA, APHA, PtHA, NSBA, ApHC, POA, AMHC, AMHR, ABRA, PHBA. Sandy currently sits on the APHA judges committee and is a state director for Florida. She has also judged major events like the AQHA Level 1 East Championships. Like many of the youth here at the YEDA Nationals Sandy came up through youth programs like 4-H. Sandy still finds time to give lessons.

Judge D: Theresa Pelton

Teresa showed paint horses as a youth where she won multiple world titles. She Graduated from Chico State University, California with a degree in Ag business with a minor in Animal Science. She has been training and showing horses for 30 years with multiple world champions in Hunter Under Saddle, Horsemanship, Trail and Western Riding. Teresa holds cards with APHA, PtHA and POA. She had judged the APHA World Show, Color Breed Congress, and Paint Horse Congress multiple times. With her husband Jim, they currently operate Pelton Show Horses in Summerfield, Florida.

TIE BREAKING RULES

Multiple Judge Scoring

Combining Judges' Cards for the overall Placings:

The multiple judge system used for combining the judges' cards for the overall placings is a modified version of the AQHA Multiple Judges System found in the AQHA Rulebook. Judges will place the class independently, placing all riders on their card. Each placing will then be given a numerical score and then these scores are combined to determine the overall placings. See chart below for the numerical scores for each placing.

Tie Breaking Rules Class Ties:

In the event of a tie in a class, it will be broken by the tie breaker judges' card, not the score sheet.

Friday Tie Breaker Judges with two arenas:

<u>Bess Neil Arena</u> – Tie Breaker judge will be Judge B <u>J. Max Everhart Arena</u> - Tie Breaker judge will be Judge A

Saturday Tie Breaker Judges with two arenas:

<u>Bess Neil Arena</u> – Tie Breaker judge will be Judge C <u>J. Max Everhart Arena</u> - Tie Breaker judge will be Judge D

Sunday Tie Breaker Judges:

High Point Rider Ties:

In the event of a tie in the individual high point rider competition, the tie will be broken by a horse knowledge question asked by the appointed judge. The tie breaker judge for the High School High Point Rider is Judge B. The tie breaker judge for the Junior High School High Point Rider will be broken by Judge C. The tie breaker judge for the Elementary Pearl High Point Rider will be broken by Judge D.

Top Team Placement Ties Tie Breaking Rules:

In the event of a tie in the team standings, the tie will be broken by the team with the most number of 1st places, if still tied then the team with the most number of second places, if still tied this pattern will continue for 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th places.

In the event this method does not break the tie; the high school team tie will be broken by the team who placed the highest in Diamond Rail/Pattern Team Horsemanship. The junior high tie will be broken by the highest placing team in the Sapphire Rail/Pattern Team Horsemanship. If neither team have a rider in the aforementioned classes, then the tie will be broken using the next lower division rail horsemanship.
